### **Quick Search Method**

- 1. Go to the Western Libraries website at lib.uwo.ca
- 2. Search the article title in the Omni search bar
- 3. Locate the result, verifying that all other information (i.e. the author(s), journal title, volume and issue number, etc.) matches what is given in the original citation
- **4.** Click on the title to open the detailed view pane and scroll down to the "View Online" section. Click on any of the links shown under "Full Text Availability" to be taken to the database where the article lives. From there, you can either read the article or download the article as a PDF



#### Journal Search Method

- 1. Go to the Western Libraries website at lib.uwo.ca
- 2. Search the journal title in the search bar





4. Use the publication date, the volume number and the issue number from the citation to find the issue where the article was published. Note that the final article page may look different depending on the database that the journal is stored in

# Browse specific issues

The list is currently ordered by most recent issue first. View oldest issue first



5. Identify the article in the results list by title and author. Click on the article title to be taken to the article page where you will be able to view or download the article
